# Information

## Complainants' Review Committee

This Information Sheet is used to answer some of the common questions complainants have regarding the Complainants' Review Committee. The Complainants' Review Committee Request Form is available on our website at [www.lawsociety.bc.ca](http://www.lawsociety.bc.ca). Please read this form prior to submitting your Request Form.

### **What is the Complainants' Review Committee?**

The Complainants' Review Committee is made up of Appointed Benchers (who are not lawyers), and Benchers or Non-Benchers, who are lawyers. The Benchers make up the Board of Directors of the Law Society. The members of the Committee are appointed by the Law Society's President at the beginning of each year. Your complaint will be reviewed by a panel made up of half of the Committee's members, one of whom will be an Appointed Bencher.

### **What is the purpose of the Complainants' Review Committee?**

The purpose of the Committee's review of your complaint is to determine whether the decision to close the file as not warranting further action by the Law Society was appropriate in light of the information received.

### **What does the Committee have authority to do with my file?**

- The Committee can, on the direction of an Appointed Bencher member of the Committee, make enquiries of the complainant, the lawyer or any other person.
- The Committee can confirm the decision to take no further action;
- The Committee can refer the complaint to the Practice Standards Committee or the Discipline Committee.

### **What does the Committee not have authority to do with my file?**

- The Committee has no authority to conduct a further investigation of your complaint.
- The Committee cannot review new complaints received from the complainant.

- The Committee does not have the authority to make a finding of professional misconduct or incompetence on the part of any lawyer.
- The Committee cannot authorize disciplinary action.

### **Who can request a review?**

Any complainant can request a review of their complaint by the Complainants' Review Committee if the file was closed under Rule 3-8 to take no further action. If your complaint was closed under section Rule 3-5(3) the Complainants' Review Committee has no authority to review your complaint.

### **How can I request a review?**

Please fill out the Complainants' Review Committee Request Form indicating your reasons for review. The Request Form is available on our website at [www.lawsociety.bc.ca](http://www.lawsociety.bc.ca).

### **Is there a deadline to apply for a review and are there exceptions to this deadline?**

To initiate a review, you must apply to the Complainants' Review Committee within 30 days after the decision is communicated to you.

Pursuant to Rule 3-14(3) of the Law Society Rules 2015, only the Chair of the Committee has the authority to grant time extensions “in extraordinary circumstances beyond the control of the complainant”. Your reasons for missing the 30-day deadline will be provided to the Chair of the Committee and he/she will consider your request and decide whether to grant you a time extension.

### **Will my request and the information I provide to the Law Society be disclosed to the lawyer?**

Yes. Any additional information you send to the Law Society will be disclosed to the lawyer and the Complainants' Review Committee. The Law Society may at its discretion talk to any third parties that have relevant information to the complaint. Our records are subject to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act and as a result, information gathered by the Law Society may be disclosed, on request, to other persons whose interests are affected. ### **What other information do I need to send in?**

The Committee has your complete file and conducts its review based solely on the file materials. The Committee cannot review new complaints that have not been investigated and assessed by staff of the Professional Regulation Department.

### **Where do I send my Request Form?**

### **How long until my complaint is reviewed?**

Reviews are scheduled on a first come first, served basis, not a priority sequence. The Committee tries to complete all reviews within 90 days of receiving the review request.

### **Can I attend my review?**

No. This is not a hearing. Neither the lawyer nor the complainant can attend this review.

### **Will I hear about the outcome of my file review?**

Yes. The Committee will mail a copy of its written decision to you.
