ON THE APPLICATION of the petitioner, the Law Society of British Columbia (the "Law Society"), coming on for hearing at Vancouver, British Columbia, on 15 August 2018, and on hearing Michael J. Kleisinger, lawyer for the Law Society, and with no one appearing on behalf of the respondent, Susan Margaret Ben-Oliel, who, although duly served, failed to file any response to petition:

THIS COURT ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Until such time as she becomes a member in good standing of the Law Society, Susan Margaret Ben-Oliel is permanently prohibited and enjoined from engaging in the practice of law as defined in section 1 of the *Legal Profession Act*, S.B.C. 1998, c. 9, including:
 - (a) appearing as counsel or advocate;
 - (b) drawing, revising or settling
 - a petition, memorandum, notice of articles or articles under the Business Corporations Act, or an application, statement, affidavit, minute, resolution, bylaw or other document relating to the

- incorporation, registration, organization, reorganization, dissolution or winding up of a corporate body;
- (ii) a document for use in a proceeding, judicial or extrajudicial,
- (iii) a will, deed of settlement, trust deed, power of attorney or a document relating to a probate or a grant of administration or the estate of a deceased person,
- (iv) a document relating in any way to a proceeding under a statute of Canada or British Columbia;
- (v) an instrument relating to real or personal estate that is intended, permitted or required to be registered, recorded or filed in a registry or other public office;
- doing an act or negotiating in any way for the settlement of, or settling, a claim or demand for damages;
- (d) agreeing to place at the disposal of another person the services of a lawyer;
- (e) giving legal advice;
- (f) making an offer to do anything referred to in paragraphs (a) to (e); and
- (g) making a representation that she is qualified or entitled to do anything referred to in paragraphs (a) to (e)

for or in the expectation of a fee, gain or reward, direct or indirect from the person for whom the acts are performed.

- 2. Until such time as she becomes a member in good standing of the Law Society, Ms. Ben-Oliel is permanently prohibited and enjoined from:
 - commencing, prosecuting or defending a proceeding in any court, except if representing herself as an individual party to a proceeding, acting without counsel, solely on her own behalf; and
 - b. representing herself as a lawyer, attorney, barrister and solicitor, or any other title that connotes that she is qualified or entitled to practise law.

- Until such time as she becomes a member in good standing of the Law Society,
 Ms. Ben-Oliel is required to inform potential clients that:
 - a. she is not a lawyer;
 - b. she is not a member of the Law Society; and
 - c. IP Law Complete is not a law firm.
- 4. Provided Ms. Ben-Oliel remains a registered patent agent in good standing with the Canadian Intellectual Property Office, this order does not prohibit Ms. Ben-Oliel from performing those services specifically authorized by the *Patent Act*, RSC, 1985, c. P-4 and its regulations.
- 5. The Law Society is awarded its costs fixed at 2 500 00.
